

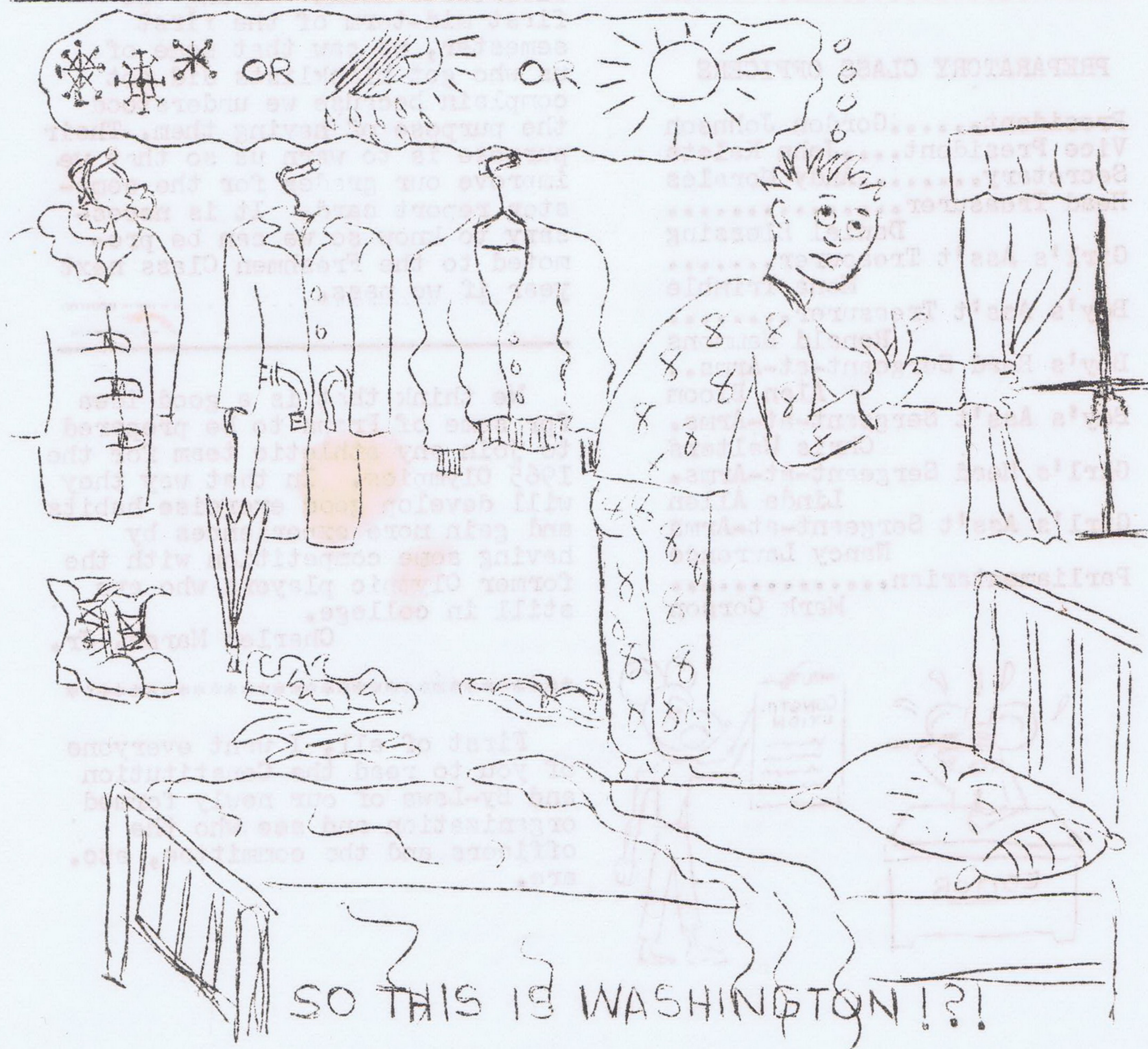

CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS
OF THE
PREPARATORY BOYS' GOVERNMENT
OF
GALLAUDET COLLEGE

CONSTITUTION

Article 1 - Name

The name of this organization shall be the Preparatory Boys' Government of Gallaudet College.

Article 11 - Purpose

The purpose of this organization shall be to cooperate with the college authorities; to provide a residence hall that will promote an atmosphere conducive to study and harmonious group living.

Article 111 - Membership

The membership of this organization shall consist of every male student who is enrolled in the Preparatory Class at Gallaudet College.

Article 1V - Officers

The officers of this organization shall consist of a President, a first Vice-President, a second Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and a Parliamentarian. They shall be elected at the first meeting of this organization in September and serve until the regular January meeting at which time new officers may be elected.

Article V - Meetings

Section 1. This organization shall meet on the fourth Wednesday of every month from September through May.

Section 2. The regular September meeting shall be the Election Meeting.

Article VI - Amendments

The Constitution of this organization may be amended at any meeting provided that written notice of such amendment has been given at the previous regular meeting. An amendment shall become part of this Constitution if passed by two-thirds of the members present, quorum vote.

BY-LAWS

Article 1 - Duties of Officers

Section 1. The President shall enforce the Constitution, By-Laws, and all laws of this organization; shall preside at all meetings of this organization and of the Executive Council at which he is present; shall serve as an ex-office member of all committees; shall appoint a Parliamentarian subject to the approval of the membership; shall assume the responsibility of mail distribution of the "Head Prep"; shall appoint special committees whenever he deems necessary; and, shall be a member of the Student Court of the Student Body Government of Gallaudet College.

Section 2. The first Vice-President shall preside at all meetings of this organization and of the Executive Council whenever the President is absent; shall assume the duties of the President in case of his resignation or otherwise; shall be the Chairman of the Recreation Committee; and, shall automatically be "Assistant Head Prep."

Section 3. The second Vice-President shall preside at all meetings of this organization and of the Executive Council when and if the President and the first Vice-President are absent from such meeting; shall succeed the first Vice-President upon his resignation or otherwise; shall be the Chairman of the Reading Room Committee; and, shall assist the President and the first Vice-President in the distribution of the mail.

Section 4. The Secretary shall keep minutes of all meetings of this organization and of the Executive Council; shall post notice of the time and place of such meetings; and, shall be responsible for all necessary correspondence.

Section 5. The Treasurer shall be responsible for all financial transactions of the organization, and the money of the Preparatory Boys' Reading Room received from Student Body Government Activity Fees; shall keep an accurate record of this organization's receipts and expenditures; and, shall report the condition of the treasury at each regular meeting of this organization and of the Executive Council.

Section 6. The Parliamentarian shall advise the President on matters or issues relating to the Constitution and By-Laws of the Preparatory Boys' Government; and, shall also advise the President of parliamentary procedures according to the Robert's Rules of Order.

Article 11 - Executive Council

Section 1. The Executive Council shall consist of all officers of this organization and five members who are to be elected by the membership of this organization at the Election Meeting.

Section 2. The Executive Council shall meet at least once a month to consider and to act upon all matters that are brought to the Officers' attention or that rise from time to time. It shall also enact regulations for the Readin room.

Section 3. The quorum shall be at least a majority of the entire membership of the Executive Council.

Article III - Committees

Section 1. The Standing Committees shall be following:

- Recreation Committee
- Reading Room Committee

Section 2. Committees shall be appointed by the President.

Article IV - Quorum

The quorum of at least 50% of the entire membership shall be required for the transaction of all meetings of this organization.

Article V - Order of Business

2. Reading of minutes
3. Officers' reports
4. Committees' reports
5. Communications
6. Unfinished business
7. New business
8. Announcements
9. Adjournment

Article VI - Advisors

The Advisors of this organization shall be the Dean of the Preparatory Boys, the Dean of Men, the Assistant Dean of Students, and the Dean of Students.

Article VII - Amendments

The By-Laws may be amended at any meeting provided that written notice of such amendment has been given at the previous regular meeting. An amendment shall become part of the By-Laws by two-thirds of the members present, a quorum vote.

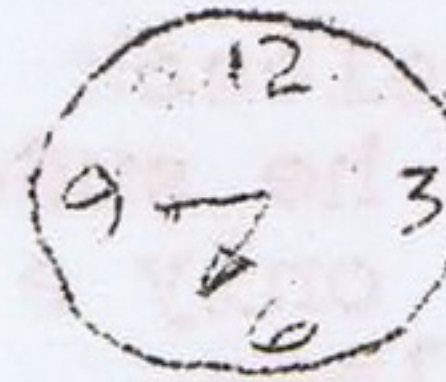
The Magnificent Masquerade Party

On March 13th, we had our monthly party, entitled "Masquerade". Melba Yeater and her committee deserve a lot of thanks for making this party an enjoyable affair.

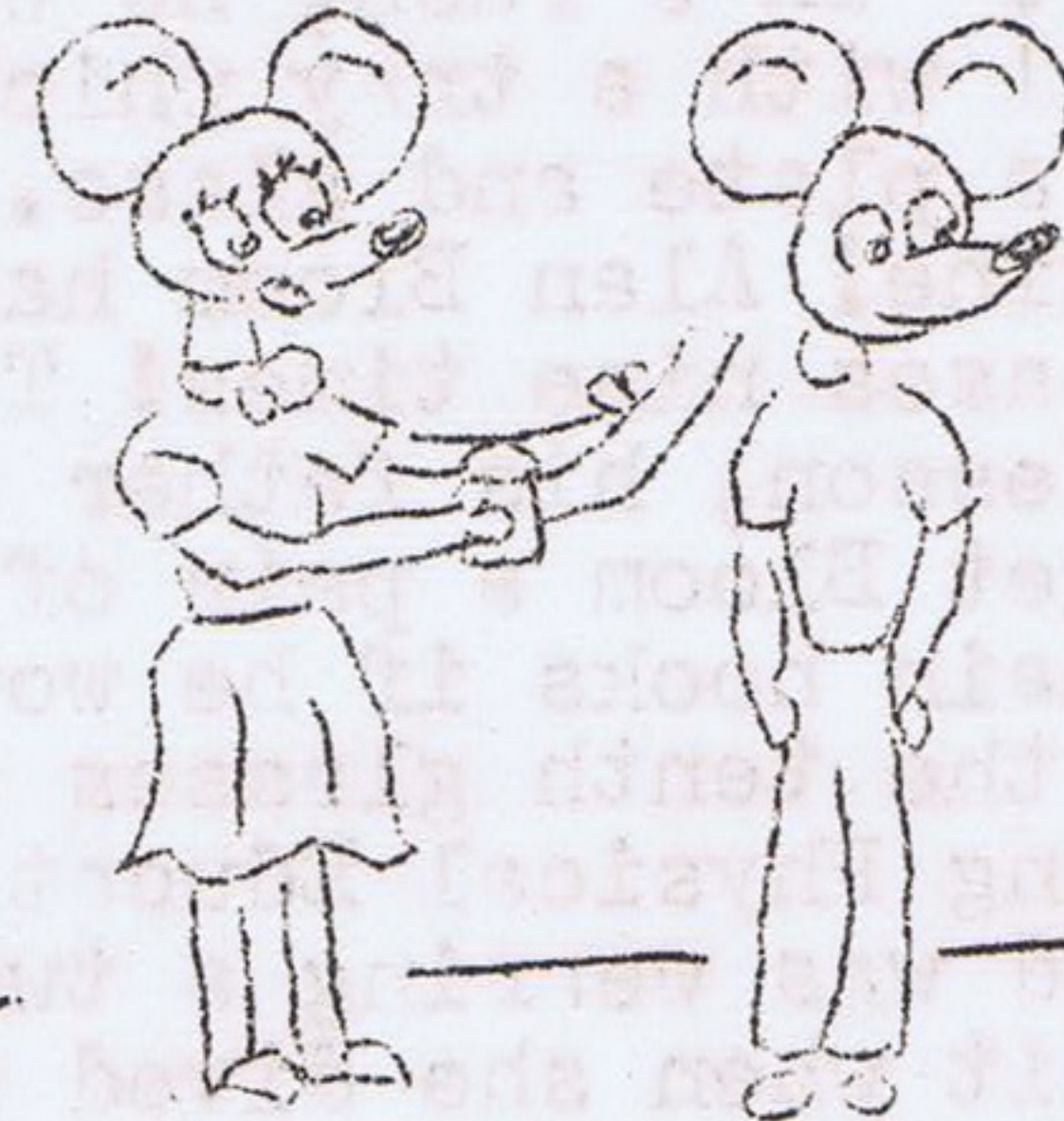

G.A.A. Party

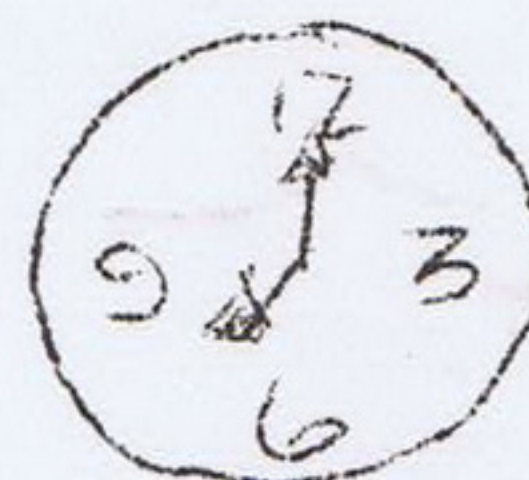

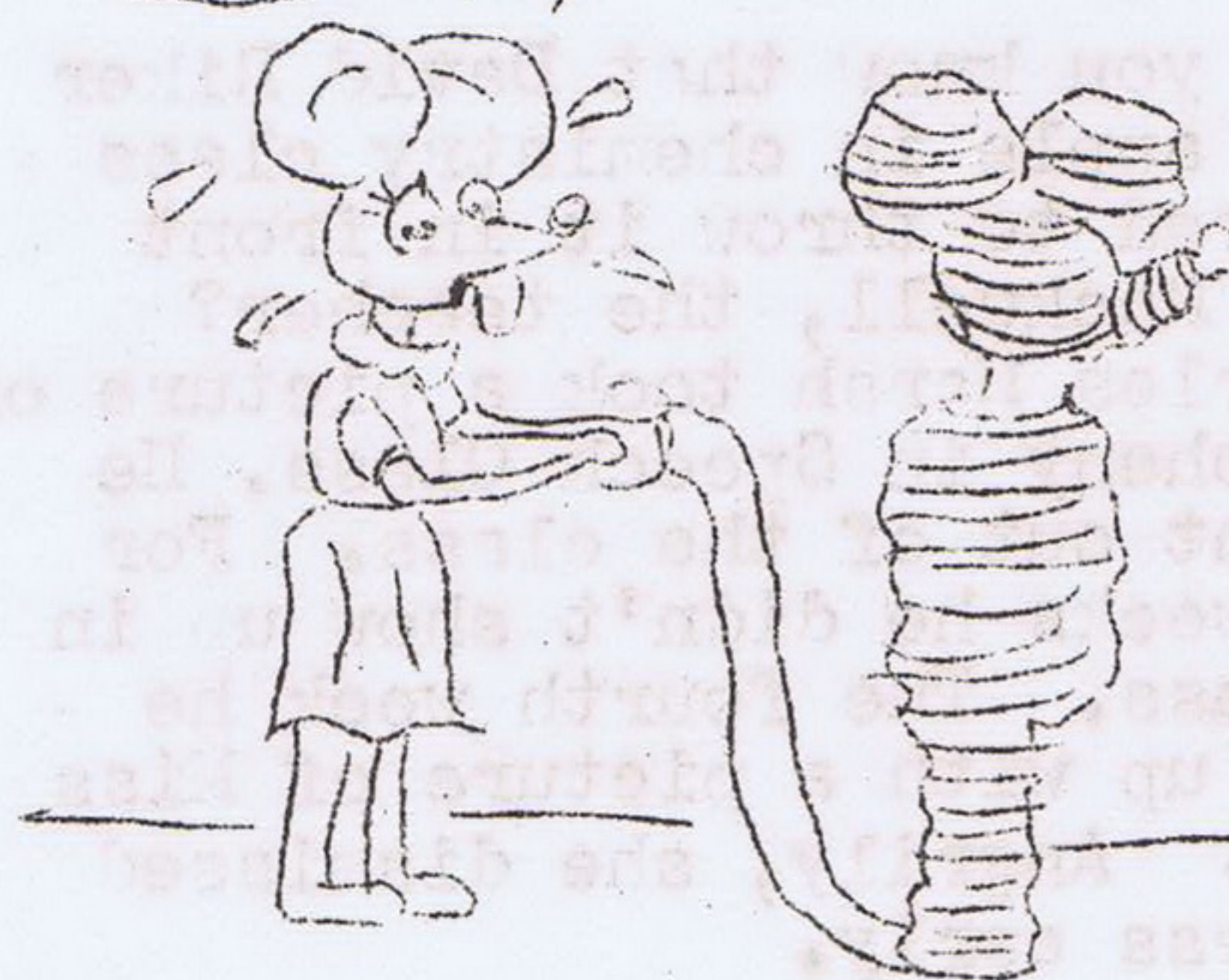

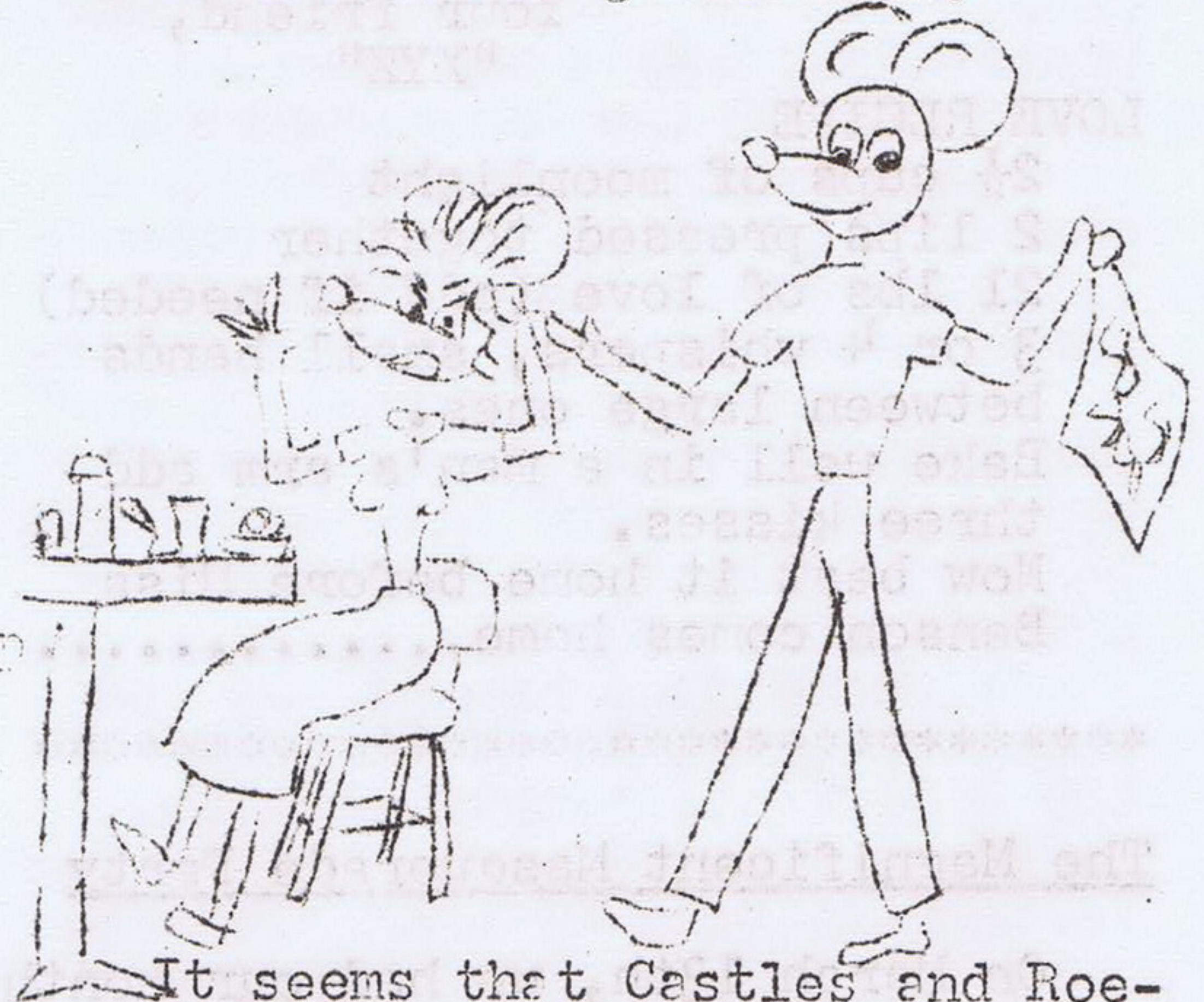

Did you know that David Riker ate an apple in chemistry class and dared to throw it in front of Mr. Rockwell, the teacher?

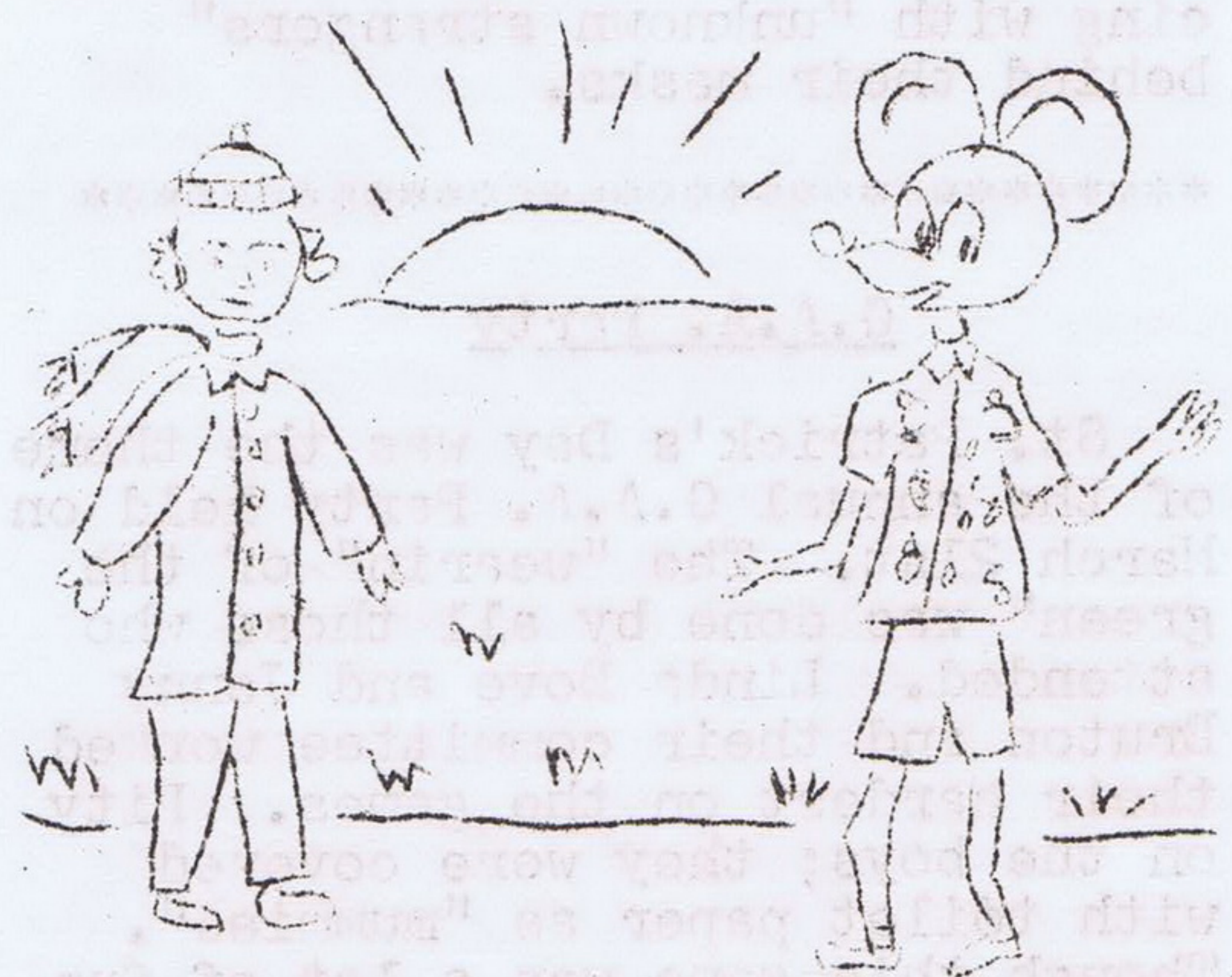

Many Uppers wore heavy coats during the warm weather on March 5th, but most of the preparatory students wore cotton clothes and no coats.



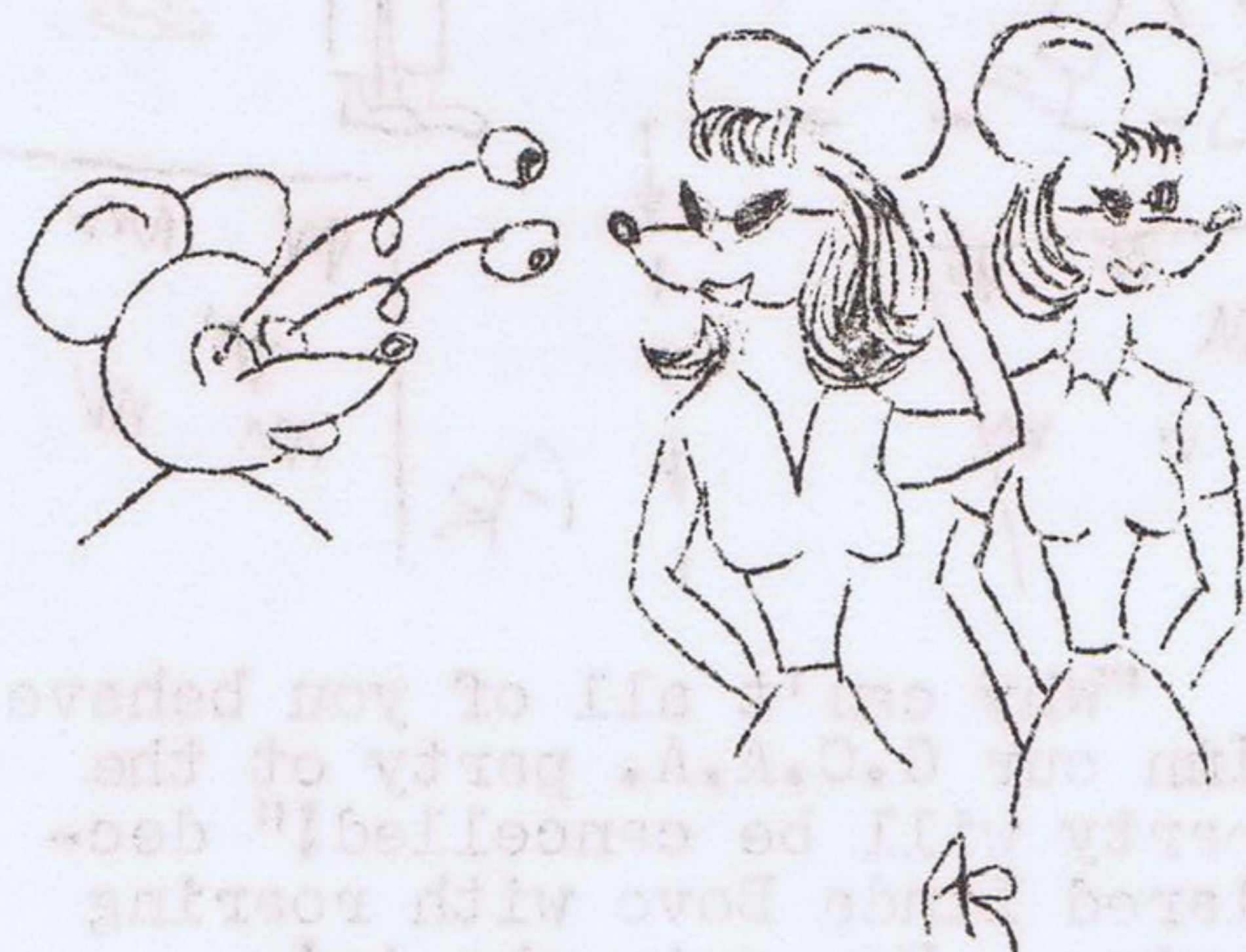
Robert Zatko, the singing Prep, has a beard like Mitch Miller's. Why don't we cooperate and sing a song along with Bob sometimes?

One windy day Margaret Holcomb was talking with an understanding boy, when the wind blew her dress up two times. Luckily she were a pair of prettipants.

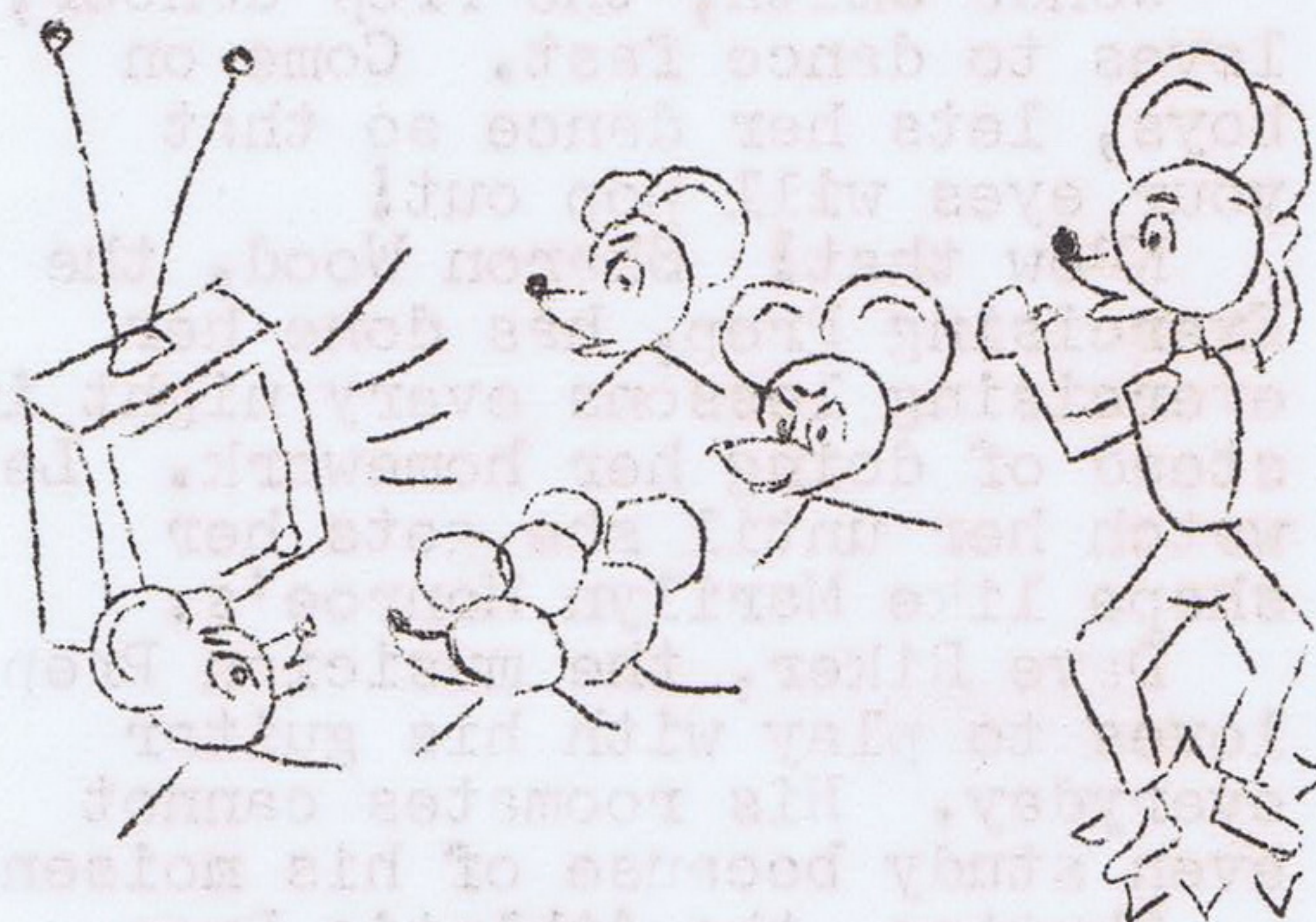
It seems that Ken Mikos, the youngest prep, loves to talk with the Californian girls anytime. He has a special girl, Melba Yeater, to talk with in classes.

VARSITY TRACK

Those fourteen Preparatory students uniting to compete for our college track squad are: Marsh, Henes, and Skedsmo from California, Trahan and Stringer from Louisiana, G. Hendrix from Washington, Manion from Missouri, Wm. Smith from Kansas, Dyreson from Wisconsin, Steadman from Arkansas, Green from Texas, Sahlin from Connecticut, Moore from Illinois, and Dye from Oklahoma. They make up two-thirds of the entire track squad, which

is assisted by Riker, Vernon, Corson, Hammons, Burpo, and O'Connor as track managers. Our first dual meet against Towson State College on March 26 was windy and cold. The track events: in the 440 yard relay, three Prepsters; Dyreson, Hendrix, and Marsh and one Sophomore star Al Couthen, beat Towson easily. Our time was clocked at 46.2 seconds. In the 100 yard dash, Dyreson and Marsh was second (10.7) and third (11 flat) respectively. In the 120 yard high hurdlers and 330 yard intermediate hurdlers, Hendrix beat out Ramborger in both heats and his time was 16 flat and 43 flat; Both Preparats finishing first-second in the 880 yard run were Wm. Smith and Skedsmo. Smith's time was 2:05.5 and Skedsmo's time was 2:10. In the mile, Sahlin was fourth, being clocked at 5:20 in spite of Scriptor's 4:38.2 mile: in the 220 yard dash, Dyreson, and Marsh were second (24.2) and fourth (25) respectively in the mile relay Hendrix, L. Smith, a junior, Wm. Smith and Dyreson were clocked first at 3:39. In the Field Events: Green and Stringer were second and third respectively in shot put; Trahan and Skedsmo were first (10') and third (9'6") respectively in Pole Vault; Moore was third in discus and was third in high jump - left with a pulled muscles in his leg while he jumped at 5'2". Marsh was second in both the broad jump (20'2") and the triple jump (37'11")

Manion was supposed to run in the 100 yard and 220 yard dashes and some relays, but he was out of this meet with a pulled muscle in his leg; Henes was supposed to run in some events, but he had an injured foot. I hope Henes and Manion recover quick.

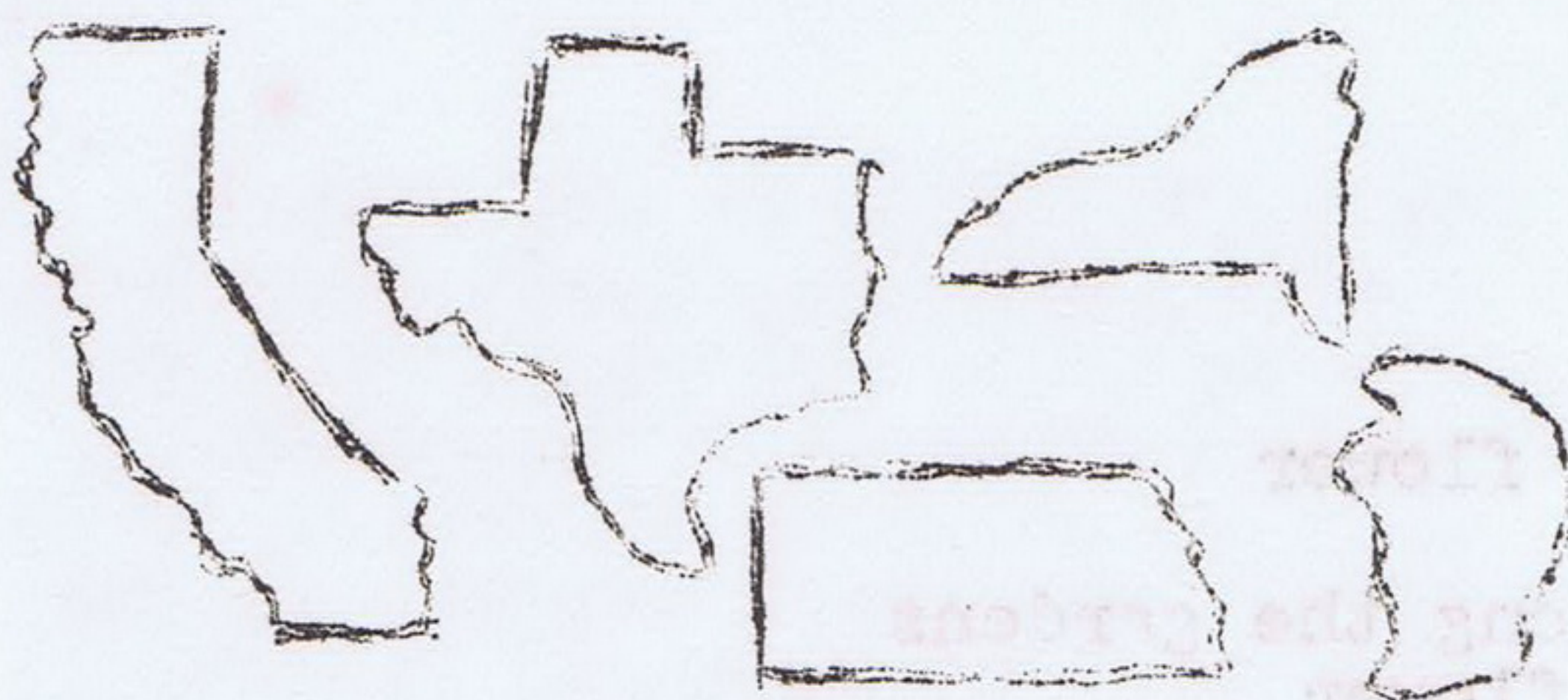
VARSITY TRACK

Those fourteen Preparatory students uniting to compete for our college track squad are: Marsh, Henes, and Skedsmo from California, Trahan and Stringer from Louisiana, G. Hendrix from Washington, Manion from Missouri, Wm. Smith from Kansas, Dyreson from Wisconsin, Steadman from Arkansas, Green from Texas, Sahlin from Connecticut, Moore from Illinois, and Dye from Oklahoma. They make up two-thirds of the entire track squad, which

is assisted by Riker, Vernon, Corson, Hammons, Burpo, and O'Connor as track managers. Our first dual meet against Towson State College on March 26 was windy and cold. The track events: in the 440 yard relay, three Prepsters; Dyreson, Hendrix, and Marsh and one Sophomore star Al Couthen, beat Towson easily. Our time was clocked at 46.2 seconds. In the 100 yard dash, Dyreson and Marsh was second (10.7) and third (11 flat) respectively. In the 120 yard high hurdlers and 330 yard intermediate hurdlers, Hendrix beat out Ramborger in both heats and his time was 16 flat and 43 flat; Both Preparats finishing first-second in the 880 yard run were Wm. Smith and Skedsmo. Smith's time was 2:05.5 and Skedsmo's time was 2:10. In the mile, Sahlin was fourth, being clocked at 5:20 in spite of Scriptor's 4:38.2 mile: in the 220 yard dash, Dyreson, and Marsh were second (24.2) and fourth (25) respectively in the mile relay Hendrix, L. Smith, a junior, Wm. Smith and Dyreson were clocked first at 3:39. In the Field Events: Green and Stringer were second and third respectively in shot put; Trahan and Skedsmo were first (10') and third (9'6") respectively in Pole Vault; Moore was third in discus and was third in high jump - left with a pulled muscles in his leg while he jumped at 5'2". Marsh was second in both the broad jump (20'2") and the triple jump (37'11")

Manion was supposed to run in the 100 yard and 220 yard dashes and some relays, but he was out of this meet with a pulled muscle in his leg; Henes was supposed to run in some events, but he had an injured foot. I hope Henes and Manion recover quick.

I hope they will be much better than in the previous meet and train very hard to be better track athletes.
